Confirmation 2022

We will be Confirming our young people at the 6.30pm Mass on Saturday 4th June 2022 - Pentecost weekend. Any young people (or not so young) of school Year 8 and above are most welcome to join us. We will need to see a CATHOLIC Baptism Certificate along with proof of receiving 1st Holy Communion. Details of the course and registration will be available throughout December after 10.15am Mass or contact Father Seba for a registration form. Dates of the programme will be available soon. The first session will be on Wednesday 5th January 2022 in the parish hall at 7.00 for Confirmandi only. It is vitally important that all the programme is completed. The sessions will not be every week so there will be plenty of time to fit it in between exams and schoolwork. As normal, we are asking people for help to enable us to provide this programme. Pray in front of the Blessed Sacrament and listen to see if the Lord is calling you for help, if so please contact Mary 07985 360960 or Fr Seba. Whilst recognising the important of parents and relations on a young person faith journey it is not suitable for them to be engaged as catechists in the programme. Guidance from CBCEW - Monday 13th December 2021

Dear Reverend Clergy, Dear Parish Administrators, Ladies and Gentlemen,

I hope this email finds you well.

Further to my email of yesterday morning following the Prime Minister's announcement on Wednesday evening, Canon Chris Thomas, General Secretary of the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, has prepared further guidance for churches – <u>see attached</u>.

There is little change from last week's guidance note from the Bishops' Conference, apart from the wearing of face coverings, which is now mandatory in churches. There is also a clarification on singing, where the recommendation from the Bishops Conference goes beyond what the Government is saying, in that the Catholic Church in England and Wales recommends that congregational singing takes place with an applied face covering. Please note, as before, and clarified in this guidance, scholae cantorum and choirs are not obliged to wear face masks when singing during the Sacred Liturgy.

Blessed William of Fenoli



Hermit in the Torre Mondovi region. Carthusian lay-brother at the Charterhouse of Casularum, Lombardy, Italy where he managed the house's external affairs. He was wholly un-learned in theology, philosophy or the ways of the world from aside his assigned duties, but in spiritual life and good works he was considered a saint in life. One day when coming in from the fields, William was attacked by thieves, and defended himself by tearing leg the off donkey and using it as a club to drive off the attackers: afterwards he re-attached the leg, and the pair

continued home.
