# **Notre Dame School News**

Bless our school as we learn together. Nourish our lives with love and joy. Let this be a happy school always, where all are welcomed and respected. A place where we can pray, worship and work together. Amen.

This week, one of the Year 6 Prayer Heroes created a presentation for Collective Worship. The PowerPoint was based on how Jesus taught with great wisdom, but people found it hard to believe in him. It contained relevant scripture, prayer, a Gospel reflection, images and a follow-on activity. Whilst the children are provided with a theme for the Collective Worship PowerPoints, they are solely created by the Prayer Heroes. Another beautiful example of pupil led Collective Worship at Notre Dame.



We are constantly developing ways in which we can educate the pupils, using real life experiences. During the lockdown, pupils that still attended school, planted potatoes. Last week, we harvested them, cooked them, and made a potato salad. This covered multiple areas of the curriculum – planting the potatoes and watching them change and grow (Science) and harvesting, preparing and cooking them (Food Technology). In addition, the pupils learnt about ways they can contribute to creating a sustainable world (Religious Education (RE) and Relationships and Health Education (RHE)). They thoroughly enjoyed the experience...especially eating their crop!

### **Attending mass**

### St Thomas the Apostle

There is very little about the apostle Thomas in the Gospels; one text calls him the "twin." Rarely during Jesus' lifetime does he stand out among his colleagues. There is the instance before the raising of Lazarus, when Jesus was still in Perea, and Thomas exclaimed: "Let us also go and die with Him." Best-known is his expression of unbelief after the Saviour's death, giving rise to the phrase "doubting Thomas."

In the Breviary lessons Pope St. Gregory the Great makes the following reflections: "Thomas' unbelief has benefited our faith more than the belief of the other disciples; it is because he attained faith through physical touch that we are confirmed in the faith beyond all doubt. Indeed, the Lord permitted the apostle to doubt after the resurrection; but He did not abandon him in doubt. By his doubt and by his touching the sacred wounds the apostle became a witness to the truth of the resurrection. Thomas touched and cried out: My Lord and my God! And Jesus said to him: Because you have seen Me, Thomas, you have believed. Now, if Thomas saw and touched the Saviour, why did Jesus say: Because you have seen Me, Thomas, you have believed? Because he saw something other than what he believed. For no mortal man can see divinity. Thomas saw the Man Christ and acknowledged His divinity with the words: My Lord and my God. Faith, therefore, followed upon seeing."
