This week, the Collective Worship PowerPoint was preparing children for the 27<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Prayer Heroes provided music and images for reflection, prayer, scripture, and a follow up activity. It is amazing that the Prayer Heroes are working alongside staff to provide Collective Worship sessions to the children at Notre Dame. Our Prayer Heroes were also provided with the opportunity to attend Mass at St George's Cathedral in London. They joined other children from the Diocese to attend Mass and celebrate the beginning of the new school year. They represented the school beautifully

Year 6 went to visit St George's Garrison Church, in Woolwich, this week to learn about its history. They learned that the church which was designed by Thomas H Wyatt (1807-1880). It is in an Italian-Romanesque style, built between 1862-63 to serve the Royal Artillery. Year 6 visited this church as it links to their history topic – World War II. St George's Garrison church was bombed during World War II. The church survives as an evocative ruin with recently conserved mosaics. The children were immersed in the history of this local church.

Finally, this week, we received a visit from an Education Officer and Advisor for Religious Education from the Education Commission. He watched lessons, looked at the children's' RE books and spoke to the children. He was extremely impressed with the knowledge and spirituality of the children he spoke to, and both their verbal and written responses in their RE lessons.

#### Saint of the day

St Gerard of Brogne



Born to the Belgian nobility: son of Stance and Plectrude. Raised in military а atmosphere. Courtier to the Count of Namur. Disappointed by court life, and ashamed of the many privileges he received from his family and military post, Gerard realized that he was called to the monastic life. He found Belgian monasteries too lax in their discipline. While visiting France in 917 on a mission from the Count, Gerard decided the life of the monks of Saint Denis was right for him. He settled his worldly affairs and took vows at the monastery. There Gerard became an example to other monks in following the Rule, and in his devotion to prayer. His life, and his encouragement of the brothers, helped Saint Denis becoming an example for monasteries throughout Europe. He was ordained but wrestled with feelings of inadequacy as a priest. After 11 years, the abbot asked Gerard to return home to form a monastery there. Abbot of the new monastery, he soon gained renown for his strict observance of the Benedictine Rule. This led many religious and political leaders to request that he reform monasteries throughout Flanders, Lorraine, and Champagne.
