## LAUDATOSIANIMATORS

The theme this week will be **water**, a vital commodity which is becoming rare even in our Diocese, where we see parched grass and dying trees, with loss of biodiversity.

**Para 30....** Access to safe, drinkable water is a basic and universal human right, since it is essential to human survival and, as such, is a condition for the exercise of other human rights. Our world has a grave social debt towards the poor who lack access to drinking water, because they are denied the right of a life consistent with their inalienable dignity.

**Para 32....** The loss of forests and woodlands entail the loss of species which may constitute extremely important resources in the future, not only for food but also for curing diseases and other uses. Different species contain genes which could be key resources in years ahead for meeting human needs and regulating environmental problems.....

**To do: Save water. Take a shower rather than a bath. Turn taps off when cleaning your teeth. Reuse water to water gardens. Install a water butt.**
